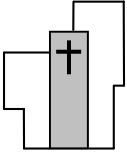


MINISTRY FOR TOMORROW UPDATE



The plans for the renovation of the nave, chapel and narthex have been completed, incorporating congregational input. Be sure to see the display of beautiful drawings by Dick Hibbert to see what the completed renovations will look like. We're on track for construction over the summer and into the fall. During that time, we'll "return to our roots" by using the parish hall as our primary worship space, a role it played before the current nave was built.



Fundraising activities are already making a contribution, beginning with the magnificent Baroque concert held in April. The exciting MAYFAIR is coming up on **Saturday, May 17**, and we look forward to seeing everyone there. Planning for the Christmas bazaar is already underway. These activities offer lots of opportunity to help the Ministry for Tomorrow program by sharing your time and talent.

The Canvass has yielded important progress toward our \$2.1 million MFT goal. As of early April, 149 parish families had committed \$1,061,483. That's 40 percent of families, and 51 percent of the goal. Many "alumni" families have also joined the campaign with commitments approaching \$100,000. Our extended flock has clearly been touched by the nurturing St. Andrew's environment, and is passionate about helping to create a legacy that will keep our ministries moving in the future. **MANY THANKS TO ALL!**
