RECTOR



*Dear Parish Family,*



As I write this we are about to undertake a new program year following the academic calendar. This will be my last such start with you as your rector and I am again delighted to see the rich diversity of programs that make up our parish life. The familiar beginning of opening day (Sept. 12) and the return of adult education and Christian formation classes for children brings to mind all the years of work together raising children in the faith, and working to deepen the faith journey of all in our parish. No doubt this is one of the most essential ministries in the life of any parish. It depends upon the commitment of the congregation to teach the faith to each other most especially to nurture our children and youth well.

Not long ago I encountered a young man now in his 30's who attended St. Andrew's during his childhood. He lives on the west coast now but he remembers fondly the times years ago when he was a shepherd in the Christmas pageant here. He spoke with some enthusiasm and delight of his son's participation in the Christmas pageant at their church in California. It's a simple thing but also a perfect example of the faith being passed from generation to generation and of adults and children together finding meaning for life and hope for living in the timeless holy stories of our faith. I don't think we ever fully appreciate what the simplest things mean to people and how many ways we are touched and changed by experiences that are formative and continue with us through the years.

Of course it all begins with participation and presence. You can't have wonderful formative memories of events you never participated in. But it also has to do with savoring the wonderful opportunities we have in sharing life together and realizing that the simple and commonplace ways of life are often the most memorable.

I am writing this on St. Bartholomew's Day, (August 24). The apostle Bartholomew is named among the apostles and is associated with Nathanael in the gospels. But apart from being named we know next to nothing about him. He is believed to have written a gospel but it was lost to history. He may have been martyred in India late in his life. There is little known about him that is of note and yet we are assured that he did his part and made his presence known in a quiet, unremarkable way.

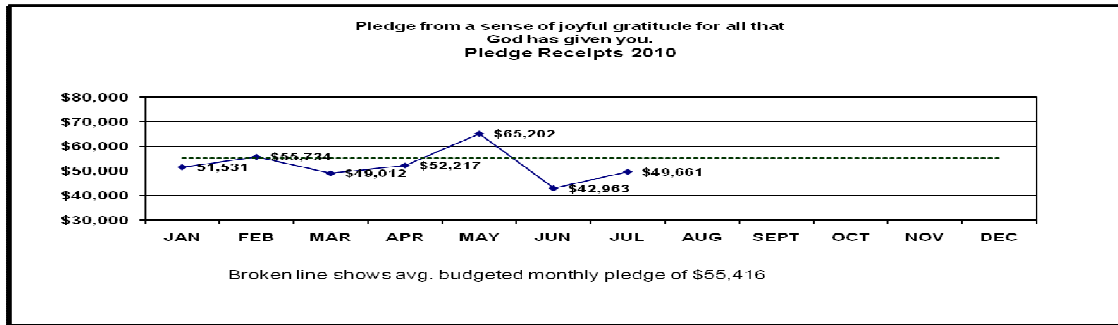
I have a feeling that there are a lot of Bartholomew's in the church who year by year carry on the work of ministry and are present to people in ways that change them and leave them with formative experiences and memories. The contribution that each of us makes is significant to someone and may be transforming for a few. We need always to offer our gifts for ministry with assurance and trust that God will prosper and multiply what we offer in ways that we can never fully imagine. If there is one thing I know for sure from my years at St. Andrew's, it is that.

The collect for St. Bartholomew's day says "*Almighty God you gave your apostle Bartholomew grace to truly believe and preach your word. Grant that your Church may love what he believed and preach what he taught....*" "May it do so indeed, especially in this place, in this time, and for many, many years to come. God bless each of you in your ministry this year.

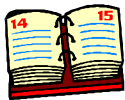
## BACK TO SUNDAY SCHOOL...PLEASE SIGN UP!

## CONFESSIONS OF A SENIOR WARDEN

With all the confessing I've been doing you are probably wondering why you ever voted me onto the vestry and how in the world I ended up as senior warden. I wonder those very things on a regular basis! That said, I just never seem to run out of things to confess. For instance, did you know that when John Jaskot asked me to run for vestry I only agreed to run if he could promise me that I absolutely would not ever have to chair the fellowship commission?

Yes, I actually had the gall to put a stipulation on my volunteering. It's not that I hate fellowship. You might recall from an earlier "confession" that it was all the food and fellowship that got me coming to St. Andrew's in the first place. I'm actually pretty good at organizing events and dinners, courtesy 26 years as a public affairs officer in the Air Force. Maybe that's why I didn't want the fellowship commission. One too many rubber chicken dinners under my belt!

Thankfully, there are plenty of other ministries at St. Andrew's. Now that folks are back from vacation, the pace at St. Andrew's really picks up and, with it, plenty of opportunities to volunteer and help out. If you take a look at the Financial NET that went out in July, you'll see what I'm talking about. I can't cover all the volunteer opportunities, but here are a few to get you thinking about ways you can use your time and talent to get involved:

- The adult choir and the Netcasters are always looking for additional voices, and you don't even have to be able to read music to join. Plus, children can feel a part of the service by joining the children's choir.
- Look around you on a typical Sunday and you'll see the labors of many volunteers – ushers, greeters, acolytes, lay Eucharistic ministers, lectors, altar guild, flower guild, choir. All are volunteers working together to bring praise to the Lord.
- Got a knack for yard work? Give our junior warden, Kim Black a call. She and Will Lambert do a commendable job, but they can't do it all.
- Want to make a difference in the local community? St. Andrew's supports: FACETS, ECHO, Habitat for Humanity, English as a Second Language, Samaritan Ministries and Five Talents. And this winter, for one week, we will provide shelter for the homeless as part of the Hypothermia Relief program.
- One volunteer job I like is assembling the church bulletins on Friday mornings. Volunteers work one Friday a month, folding and putting together the bulletins. It's not exactly rocket science, yet I really enjoy running that folding machine and then chatting with the other volunteers as we put everything together.
- Like to count money? Volunteer tellers do that each Monday. It takes a couple of hours, but Don Taggart likes to have enough tellers so that your name is on the schedule no more than once a month.
- If you like kids and like to teach, volunteer in the Sunday school, children's liturgy or the learning center. Wayne and I volunteered in the learning center for several years and loved the experience.

I haven't covered all the volunteer opportunities at St. Andrew's. Check out the Financial NET for more ideas. No doubt, in the coming months, as we begin our transition to a new rector there will be many other opportunities to volunteer – helping with the parish assessment or the search process, or helping to bid farewell to Randall and welcome the interim and then the new rector.

Yes, you don't have to look very hard to find a way to make a difference at St. Andrew's and in the broader community. Think about the talents you've been given and then find a ministry that fits your talents, desires and time. Working together to make a difference. That's what it's all about!

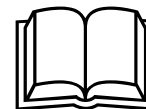

### ***Vestry Begins Work to Hire Interim Rector***

Although the parish is focusing mostly on treasuring the last few months of Randall's service and planning farewell events for Randall and Scootie, we are also moving forward in the search process. The vestry's first priority is to hire an interim rector who will provide pastoral care and worship leadership and guide us through the search for a permanent rector. The vestry has met with Lindsay Ryland, the Diocese's expert in transition matters, and she has provided a proposed process for calling an interim. At its August meeting, the vestry formed a subcommittee to focus on this process. The committee – Sandy Gumbert, Julie Morgan, Sam Palmer, Kim Black and I -- is working to discern the key ministry skills we need in an interim rector. Soon, we will receive names and resumes of potential candidates from the Diocesan Office and we'll begin the interview process. Our hope is to have a final candidate by the Oct. 11 vestry meeting. Then, on Dec. 1, the interim rector would begin a two-year term at St. Andrew's.

After the holidays, the process will begin to form a search committee to find a permanent rector.

As I've said before, this process does take some time, usually two years. But we'll have an interim rector trained in transition ministry guiding us along the way and caring for our pastoral/worship needs.

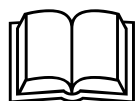
Please keep the subcommittee in your prayers as they begin the process of hiring an interim for St Andrew's!

Jeremiah 18:1-11

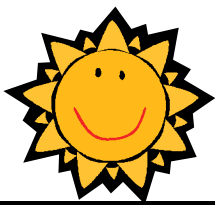

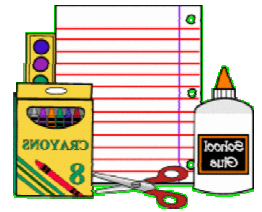

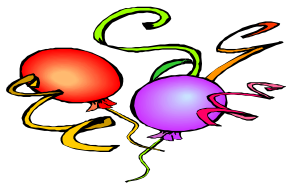
