St. Andrew's will host our annual homeless/hypothermia program from February 3rd-10th, 2019. During this week, we will welcome approximately 35-40 guests each night and provide them with food, fellowship, and shelter. This requires a huge number of volunteers and can only be done as a parish-wide effort. There are approximately 250 volunteer slots (found here: tiny.cc/dze01y) that will need to be filled in order to make this happen.

In addition to our volunteer needs, we have compiled a list of items that will help defray the cost of the program. Any donation is greatly appreciated and can be taken to the brick ledge across from the Office or to the Conference Room. Please mark all donations "Hypothermia Program." We are ready to receive donations NOW through the beginning of Hypothermia week, but prefer to receive them in late January.

Food Items: Chewy granola bars; Breakfast bars; Individual Raisin packs; Individual trail mix packs; Individual packs of chips, popcorn, pretzel, & cookies; Peanut butter or cheese cracker packs; Applesauce cups; Pudding cups; Fruit cups; Individual chocolate milk drink boxes; Bottled water (16 oz.); Individual V-8 cans.

Personal Items: Reading glasses in various powers (esp. 2.5-3.5); Earbuds; New or used cell chargers; Ear plugs; Toiletries such as travel size tooth paste, tooth brushes, soap, shampoo, hand cream, anti-bacterial wet wipes, Chap Stick, etc.; Hats; Rain ponchos; Gloves; Winter coats; Sweatpants (esp. XL); New men/women socks/underwear.
