Every winter the congregation of St. Andrew’s meets in the Parish Hall after the 10:00 a.m. service for the Annual Meeting. This year we will meet on February 10th. Members of St. Andrew’s are encouraged to attend to learn about the state of the church and vote in new members of the Vestry.

Voting at the Annual Meeting is conducted by secret ballot. No absentee ballots are allowed. To vote, a person must be:

- 1) a confirmed/registered member of St. Andrew’s
- 2) at least 16 years old
- 3) in good standing with the Church, which means you attend church on a regular basis and are a giver of record.

Even if you aren’t eligible to vote, you are encouraged to attend.

The nominees, offered by Vestry members, have been vetted by Father Tim and Pam Rozelsky, to ensure that they are church members and givers of record. Please read through them before the meeting.
