Dear Friends in Christ,

What a joy to become part of the St. Andrew's community! I frequently visit our mission statement which rings true in the midst of the pandemic and current times:

St. Andrew's is a Christian community dedicated to worship and proclaiming God's love, to growing spiritually, and to serving others through outreach, prayer, education, and fellowship. We welcome all—no matter who you are, where you find yourself in life, your thoughts about God or the Church—to join us!

Our worship of God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, remains important and the central bedrock of our mission and lives in covenant community. Thanks to so many individuals, especially Darren Williams, we are able to continue and will continue to have high quality online worship. Accessibility to worship is a tenant of the Episcopal Church and, as we gather outdoors, and discern our eventual indoor return, we will maintain a focus on everyone's ability to participate in the worship of our God.

With our four regular worship services and asynchronous worship opportunities online, I want to emphasize the focus on our worship together, One Together. It is not surprising that our survey and in conversations, I see and hear that we miss the Eucharist. In the Eucharist, we are the embodied church, gathering with those present, those who have come before, and those who will come to the Table. We now have the opportunity to reflect on what it is for which we hunger and thirst. As part of our mission, we now partake of the Word and our faith practices at home are as important as ever.

While we miss gathering as we normally would, I am encouraged by our gathering from online platforms to socially distanced (and with masks) outdoors. Our Pastoral Connection team reached out to each person in our community and I encourage you to send a text, make a call, or send a note to someone you have not heard from in a while. Our communal call and mission is pastorally centered. Many of us may not be "ok" and know that you are not alone in that feeling. You may reach out to me and please, let's reach out to each other and know that Christ is present in those moments. The presence of Christ is for what we hunger and thirst in the Eucharist, what we seek in these encounters, and how we carry out our mission.

This is the hunger and thirst I perceived in discerning the call to St. Andrew's and I now I experience it with you! In the midst of an anxiety-ridden age, we have formation opportunities, we are engaging in outreach, we have a strong stewardship team, our vestry is committed, fellowship opportunities continue, our preschool is open, our worship and acknowledgment of our dependence on God remains! Our mission is not on hold and the church is active! We do not have full view of the road ahead and we do not need to see the whole road when our focus is following Jesus. Be safe, be gentle on yourselves, and know that Christ knows you and invites you and all of us into continued relationship. We continue, One Together, in our mission!

VESTRY UPDATE

This week we invited back our children and youth for outdoor Formation on our church grounds, kicking off a new Formation year, new school year, and a new chapter in the life of our church as we regather and reconnect as a church family, both in person and virtually. In our Godly Play lesson for our youngest children (our preschool through second graders) we talked this week about the Circle of the Church Year. We talked about the concept of time as being circular and about how “for every beginning there is an ending, and for every ending there is a beginning. It goes on forever and ever.” (From Godly Play by Jerome Berryman).

As I reflect on this simple, yet profound concept I am struck by the poetry and the sheer beauty of this. In Godly Play we related this back to the story of Easter, that Jesus died which was an ending, but that he reappeared to the disciples during the season of Easter and they got to know him in a new way, which is a new beginning, just as he is still with us today, meeting us in a new way. We also talked about how the church calendar begins with Advent when the days are as short as they can possibly be and then goes around in a circle through the green growing Sundays after Pentecost where it ends, but then begins again with Advent, just as the light of the day seems to be coming to an end again.

So, as I sit here on my deck on this most beautiful fall Sunday contemplating how this relates to our church life it occurs to me that this is a great time to celebrate that. While so much has changed for us in our daily lives as we live through a pandemic (endings of the way we’ve become accustomed to living), there have been new and wonderful beginnings as well. Through it all the circle of our church year offers us continuous times of reimagining, and new beginnings as we regather in new ways.

And Friends, amidst the sadness, and the trials/endings of this past 7 months in our world and in our own parish, there is also newness, excitement, and much to celebrate and look forward to. This summer was a busy, busy time for the Vestry, during what is typically a season of slowness for us. So busy in fact that we found ourselves meeting sometimes twice in a month, rather than our typical once a month. But it was a wonderful busy, full of reimagining and new beginnings as we dusted ourselves off from what felt like the longest winter/spring to find new ways to reconnect with each other while still following Diocesan guidelines for safety. We welcomed our amazing new Priest-in-Charge, Father Will, on July 1st, and in partnership with Father Will we worked to get our church outfitted for eventual regathering in person both indoors and outside, we worked with the preschool staff to re-open our preschool in a safe manner, we reorganized our commissions and Vestry leadership to move from the interim period into our next chapter of parish life with our new priest, and we started the work of race and reconciliation through beloved community.

In short, we have celebrated so many beginnings in the past three months. Most recently we welcomed a new vestry member, Carl Jones, to fill a vestry vacancy that occurred when Ed Colliton communicated his need to step away from service to reprioritize his time commitments toward other areas of his life. We give thanks for the tremendous work Ed did while on Outreach and welcome Carl to this commission.

I am grateful for the flexibility, grace, and creativity that this Vestry has brought to the process of creating new solutions and for the sound spiritual and practical guidance and leadership of Father Will. I am excited to continue to reimagine with them and with you all how we continue to celebrate, worship, and commune with each other as we approach our next Church year.

This month our Vestry continues the work of putting together a thoughtful budget for 2021 to continue to do our good works for our parish and community, showing the love of

REGATHERING

Regathering Update

This coming Sunday, October 11th, we will hold a forum via Zoom on the status of safely regathering. We will look at the Diocesan and state requirements, our survey, and where we are in the process. All of the Diocesan requirements and guidance may be found on the [Diocesan website](#). Here is a brief overview of where we stand and what is required going forward.

At this time, we are following the guidelines to engage in limited outdoor worship and formation. As we seek indoor worship, we will discern together our own level of readiness once we are granted permission. One of the big health markers we are required to meet, in addition to sufficient medical support, is a 14-day average of 5 diagnosed cases or less per 100,000 people in our area. Once our petition is granted by the Diocese we can then move to make our own decision for our return.

Some outside groups are permitted to use our space outdoors at the moment and we will look at the potential for

indoor, small group gatherings on an as-needed basis. Our food ministry teams are permitted to be in the building. The staff continues to work from home and we are in the building for work requiring our onsite presence. The Peace Islamic Center will consider its indoor return with our own discernment for return to indoor worship. From time to time, we will seek exception, in consultation with the Diocese, for pastoral reasons.

Thank you to our regathering team for your guidance, support, and strategy. Thank you: Christie Dasher, Doug Wood, Christine Kelly, Darren Williams, Julie Morgan, Bob Heyer, Martha Turner, Rich Richardson, Aaron Goen, and Tami Phillips.

We look forward to a more in-depth presentation on Sunday. Please look for updates coming to the website soon where we will post all of our regathering resources.
