Dear Friends in Christ.

This Sunday, we enter into the season of Advent. Andy Williams and Mariah Carey will resonate throughout stores and in

households. The shopping season has likely already begun. A Christmas Carol and many Christmas movies are on repeat. The decorations come out and the tree goes up as the Thanksgiving cornucopia is overtaken by the Christmas crèche. Yes, the season is upon us, but it is quite different. As we may seek some semblance of how we typically celebrate the season, it is inevitably different this year and the shift is not just from in-store to online shopping. We face a different world and practicing discipleship takes on new forms in the same spirit as we seek to find cheer in our current pandemic reality.

Advent waits for us and arrives as scheduled. We look toward the celebration of the Incarnation and blessed birth, yes, but we primarily observe this season to proclaim Christ's second coming. As we safely sing, proclaim, and pray O come, O come, Emmanuel, we accept the invitation of hope for what we look towards. This season, our hectic and busy lives look different and we are invited into a time of holy reflection. What does that look like in a pandemic?

I know we may hope or even think it takes an extreme dedication to truly observe Advent, however, Christ meets us where we are when we accept the invitation. This season, you are invited into this holy time to observe from time to time and at the least, say the phrase, "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel," and perhaps to even sing it! As a guide, I will host short

prayer sessions and reflections a few times a week (about 5-10 minutes at most) on Facebook Live on:

- Mondays at 9:00 a.m.
- Tuesdays at 1:00 p.m.
- Thursdays at 9:00 p.m.

We are invited to pause, reflect, and remember God's presence. As we try to recreate and proceed in the season as usual, it will inevitably be different. As we approach Advent, the Kingdom remains; our hope remains; and Christ's consoling love endures! God of hope, we pray, O Come, O Come, Emmanuel!

I look forward to seeing you this Sunday online or outdoors, One Together!

Give us ears to hear, O God, and eyes to watch, that we may know your presence in our midst during this holy season of joy as we anticipate the coming of Jesus Christ. Amen*

This weekend, Sunday November 29th marks the beginning of the church calendar year, starting with the First Sunday in Advent, or even more specifically the beginning of Year B of our Lectionary for Sundays (for those planners amongst us who want to know). I am reminded of the beautiful language from the young children's Godly Play curriculum by Jerome Berryman that we use with our youngest children here at St. Andrew's where we talk about Advent as a time of getting ready, a time set aside for us to start our journey to Bethlehem, and a time intended to be less hurried than it sometimes is, in order to enable us to get ready to enter "the mystery" of Christmas. We talk about it as a time to come close to God and to make a journey together with the Prophets, Holy Family, Shepherds, and Angels. I wish our family at St. Andrew's a blessed Advent season of great wondering, peace, joy, and anticipation. I wish you moments of mindfulness and clarity as you take the time to just be and to feel the presence of God.

This month the Vestry has continued the work begun in September to prayerfully discern and allocate the use of our resources for the next calendar year of 2021 through formulation of a budget to carry out the mission and work of the church. While 2020 has plied us with challenges, it has also reminded us of the central work of the church and the blessings that we have to be able to continue to take care of our worship needs, building/grounds needs, our amazing staff, and our outreach and formation, all of which we offer to the glory of God. The Vestry gives thanks in particular this month for the time and talents given freely and abundantly by our Finance and Audit Committee (FAC), current members Libby Fike (Chair), Tony Faison, Jeff Reba, and Bob Heyer (Endowment Board Chair) to guide us through the final, and undoubtedly most difficult, point of our budgetary journey. We are indebted to these people for their experience and financial acumen to assist us in preparation of the final budget to be presented to the Parish at the annual meeting. We extend our warmest gratitude to former FAC Chair/member Hal Hendrick for his work with us during the summer and fall months as well.

Here are the ways St. Andrew's parishioners can pledge:


- 1) Mail in your annual pledge card.
