Dear Friends in Christ,

We enter the month of March in the midst of Lent looking towards Resurrection. This Lenten season may seem excessive given we

continue to endure a global pandemic with significant fasting from parts of our life we most enjoy. We continue to fast from social interactions, our traditional fellowship and worship, and, of course, from the Eucharist. We do see a light, with positive health markers and the blessing of vaccines. Still, we endure this long Lenten experience.

While Lent may seem excessive, this may be a particular time to reflect, both individually and collectively on our lives and our mortality. We now know much more about what we value in our lives and those things that, perhaps, we value less. In our invitation on Ash Wednesday, we are asked to observe a holy Lent "by self-examination and repentance; by prayer, fasting, and self-denial; and by reading and meditating on God's holy Word." How might these practices in Lent enable us to reflect on what and on whom we truly rely in our lives? I invite you into continued reflection. As said in the annual address, what are those things which we miss and need to resume and what are those practices and ways of living which we might leave behind?

Lent is also a time, as said in the invitation to a Holy Lent, when people are restored to the fellowship of the church. For no fault of our own, we have all been away from our church. As we look towards the celebration of the Resurrection and towards an eventual and gradual, safe regathering, we too reflect upon the joy we find in the fellowship of the church. Our gathering, online and physical, is something to not only value, but a time in which we encounter the Risen Lord.

Let us keep an eye on the story we know so well, the story of our redemption. Our Scripture recounts stories of exile and return, separation and restoration, death and new life. We have in this Lent an opportunity for new life and revitalized mission. St. Andrew's, we continue to hear God's call and to proclaim the Good News of the Risen Lord within our Lenten discipline and reflection. Where are we called as we begin to emerge into this opportunity for new birth?

We are looking forward to warmer temperatures without snow, sleet, or freezing rain in the forecast!



## Re-Gathering Update

The decrease in the number of cases in our area and the increase in vaccinations provides evidence of hope for regathering in the future. The Diocese has released new guidelines for when we can regather under certain circumstances. When cases reach an average of 25 (or fewer) cases per 100,000 in Fairfax County, we may resume outdoor services under our approved plans. When cases reach 10 cases (or fewer) per 100,000, we may consider regathering indoors with our approved plans. Once we meet health markers, we may decide as a parish whether we should regather. As of February 23, 2021, Fairfax County had 17.5 cases per 100,000. We will be discussing the appropriate time to resume outdoor worship.

When we are permitted to regather does not mean that we are required nor will any undue pressure be put on anyone to attend



services if it is uncomfortable. Worship will not look and feel the same as it did prior to the pandemic and your leadership has put significant efforts into safe practices for an eventual return to the building. Please know that St. Andrew's will continue to offer high-quality online worship for the foreseeable future. Please visit our COVID-19 page for further updates and other resources.
