Dear Friends in Christ,

The oldest annual celebration in our church is the Resurrection of Jesus and we are about to enter this most holy time. Without the Resurrection, the story and witness of Jesus is incomplete. It is on that day that all things are made new and we celebrate the victory over death and the gift of eternal hope. How do we commemorate and celebrate Easter? How do you celebrate and commemorate Easter?

I asked the students at our preschool this past week what happens on Easter. Yes, I did hear a lot about Easter Eggs. I also heard wonderful stories of God loving us and Jesus coming back. They asked hard questions about why Jesus died and how the tomb was empty. In the end, we all agreed to remember the story and gift of love which comes on Easter. We may then go into our lives proclaiming this Good News. For 50 days, we celebrate Easter and each day

we remember this incredible gift. When we recognize the long walks and depths of our own lives, the gift on the other side when we arise becomes so much sweeter.

I look forward to walking this journey with you this Holy Week and Easter season.

On Easter Sunday we celebrate the resurrection of Jesus, one of the chief tenets of our Christian faith. It is with great pleasure that I announce the first meetings of the Property Resource Commission have begun in earnest. First, let me say a debt of thanks on our behalf to Christine Kelly (Chair), Paul Foley, Gene Girondo, Jewell Gould, and Chuck Sleeper for agreeing to serve their upcoming terms. Jewell serves through 2022, Chuck/Gene through 2023, and Christine/Paul through 2024, with Christine as Chair through 2023.

Our main objectives for this commission are not as a "fix-it bunch," but as long- and short-term guidance for planning plant maintenance and upgrades, and working with our other standing committees, Vestry, Finance & Audit, Stewardship, and Endowment Fund to afford said projects through smart partnerships and best financial practices to accomplish our goals. With that said, there are, with me, 4 current and former Junior Wardens on the Commission, who have served 6 terms in that capacity. We are in good hands.

One example is our exterior lighting. The Commission (Lighting Lead-Gene Girondo) is looking at a partnership with Dominion Energy to upgrade our exterior lighting. By working with Dominion, we get durable/sustainable light poles, proper electrical upgrades to code, and affordable long-term financing to accomplish. It is a win-win for St. Andrew's, if we can make it work.

Finally, the work of this Commission lies in planning. We are revisiting the Mason & Mason Capital Reserve Analysts Study from 2015, and updating it with completed projects--and new/expected ones—and compiling a 15-year price tag to keep our physical plant happy & healthy, and dissipate the cost over that period.

We are excited about the road ahead, and look forward to traveling it with you, One Together.

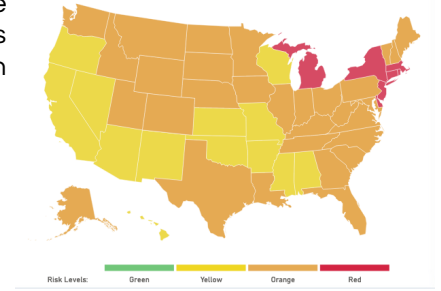
Re-Gathering Update

Beginning Palm Sunday, we will resume outdoor worship with permission from the Diocese and in accordance with Virginia Executive Order 72. Fairfax County has consistently been under 20 positive COVID-19 cases per 100,000 which is the health marker provided by the Diocese to resume outdoor worship.

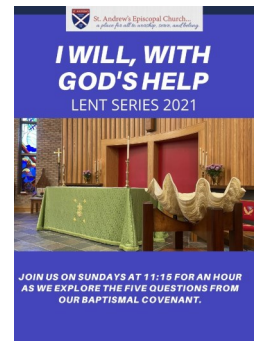
