## Re-Gathering Update

Health metrics and vaccination rates in Fairfax and surrounding areas are continuing to yield promising data. As of June 25, 2021, the rate of infection in Fairfax County was 0.4 people per 100,000 average over a 7-day period. 73.9% of residents (61.6% of all residents) 18 and older have received at least 1 dose of the vaccine and 65.2% of residents (53.5% of all residents) are fully vaccinated.

The Vestry and regathering committee have worked to find a plan of continued reopening in line with our congregation. Here are some changes that will be made this week and in the weeks to come:

### This week:

- Masks will continue to be worn as many attendees will not be able to receive a vaccine
- No registration for the Saturday 6:00 p.m. or Sunday 8:00 a.m. services
- Less surface cleaning between services
- Doors will not be propped open

### Beginning July 3rd and 4th:

- Masks will still be worn by attendees.
- All other restrictions will be lifted, including registration and social distancing at our 10:00 a.m. services.
- No registration for childcare

We will still ask volunteers and staff of our childcare locations to be fully vaccinated and, our clergy are fully vaccinated. Communion will be in one kind (bread only) which is considered full participation in the Eucharist.


