Dear Friends in Christ,

At the time of this monthly net, we walk in the midst of our annual hypothermia prevention shelter with FACETS. This is a testament of faith with an outpouring of love from our church family and the many volunteers from local faith communities. Thank you to all of the volunteers and to our residents this week. There are far too many to thank individually, however, I would like to thank Steve Koss, Donna Daugherty, Elaine Runkel, and Sharon and Jewell Gould in particular. It has been a joy to come by each night and see so many of us together in ministry for this essential ministry. It is in such relationships and community when we encounter the Risen Lord.

We can look at our ministry as acts of Christian love in response to our loving God. What are the other components of our lives which define us as Christians? These are the actions which orient our lives towards Christ. It is also in this month when we transition from this brief respite of Ordinary Time into Lent with Ash Wednesday on February 22nd. This can be a time when we re-orient our lives towards Christ with particular acts of devotion and ways of being. What are the practices you might consider as we approach this holy season?

We are working on a few offerings from St. Andrew's which may assist us on our journey of faith. You might find joy participating in the return of our Lenten Soup Supper series. Have you ever been in a Bible study? What about a Bible study which does not require advanced preparation? Have you ever attended an Ash Wednesday service or a service during Holy Week? These are some components of our parish life you might consider as we practice and lean into discipleship. I encourage you to consider and intentionally approach this Holy Season.

In this time, we also recognize the journeys of faith and dedication to the mission of the church around us. This month, we hold our annual meeting and recognize our outgoing Vestry members. I want to personally thank Betsy Cotten, Jonathan Withington, Stacey Peters, Doug Wood, and Beth Van Beek, for their dedication to St. Andrew's in their Vestry service. Their Vestry term included everything from the calling of a new Rector to a Global pandemic (and everything in between). Thank you! Ministry on Vestry and in leadership roles at our parish, is a spiritual practice which leads all of us further into faith.

We each have ways in which we may inwardly and outwardly practice and cultivate our faith. Within this article are some of the ways we as a church engage in our faith practices and some disciplines we may encounter for the season of Lent. With intentionality, we find ourselves listening and hearing God's call for us and to the path where God leads us. February is here. And as I write my final Monthly Net letter, I want to express my gratitude to the work of the Vestry, our staff and all of those who serve here. Serving in a leadership role is important, challenging, rewarding, and fulfilling work. This year has been an exceptional one. We have held a Celebration of New Ministry honoring Father Will as our 3rd Rector, many 50th Anniversary events, and we have faced exceptionally challenging decisions. We have served our community in countless ways through our Outreach Commission, and served one another in Formation and Fellowship. We had our largest Stewardship campaign to date. At the Annual Meeting you can expect to hear an update on all of these things, plus more on where we are now and where we are going. We will also elect our next Vestry

representatives as Jonathan, Stacey, Doug, Beth, and myself rotate off. This is an important meeting in the life of the church, and we'd love to see you here.

It means so much to have you here with us. There's a lot happening as we continue to come out of the pandemic. I see many of you stepping into new volunteer and/or leadership roles. I see new faces worshipping with us each week, and I see faces returning to worship after some time off. In being together in this way we're better able to engage and encourage with one another. We need you here with us. We need your contributions - big or small. We need you. I am so grateful to each of you for how you are serving St. Andrew's. I hope you will join us on February 12th for the Annual Meeting. (Childcare (and snacks) will be provided. Even if you're new around here, please join us).

Excerpt from: "A pastoral word from Presiding Bishop Michael Curry on the death of Tyre Nichols"

Sense cannot be made of the murder of a young man at the hands of five men whose vocation and calling are to protect and serve. This was evil and senseless.

There is a passage from the Hebrew prophet Jeremiah, which is later quoted in Matthew's Gospel when innocent baby boys are killed by an immoral dictator:

"A voice is heard in Ramah, lamentation and bitter weeping. Rachel is weeping for her children; she refuses to be comforted for her children, because they are no more." — Jeremiah 31:15, Matthew 2:18

With the murder of Tyre Nichols, another mother, as in the biblical texts, weeps, with the mothers of Emmett Till, Trayvon Martin, Michael Brown, George Floyd, Breonna Taylor, Ahmaud Arbery, and so many others. A family grieves. A community fears. A nation is ashamed. Like the psalmist in the Bible, something in us cries out, "How long, O Lord, how long?" How long violence, how long cruelty, how long the utter disregard for the dignity and worth of every child of God? How long?

As if this wasn't enough, there is another horrible dimension to what happened. Tyre Nichols was beaten, kicked, and cursed as if he was not a human being. Then, after he was lying on the ground, having called for his mother, they let him stay there for several minutes without anyone, including the police and EMT who were present, providing medical assistance. Not one Good Samaritan.

Jesus once told a story to teach about what it looks like to love one's neighbor, which Moses and Jesus both said is a commandment of God. It's a story about a man beaten nearly to death and left on the side of the road to die by people who knew what Moses taught about love for God and neighbor—and what the prophet Micah taught when he said that God requires three things of us: to do justice, to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God.

VESTRY NOMINATIONS

Every winter the congregation of St. Andrew's meets in the Parish Hall after the 10:00 a.m. service for the Annual Meeting. This year we will meet on February 12th. During this meeting the Annual Report is presented, Vestry members offer presentations of their work from the past year, discussions are held about what's happening in the Diocese, some Vestry members rotate off service, and new members are elected into service.

The nominees, offered by Vestry members, are vetted by Father Will and the nominating committee to ensure that they are church members and givers of record.

Voting at the Annual Meeting is conducted by secret ballot. No absentee ballots are allowed. To vote, a person must be:

- 1) a confirmed/registered member of St. Andrew's
- 2) at least 16 years old
- 3) in good standing with the Church, which means you attend church on a regular basis and are a giver of record.

The term of office for a Vestry member is three years. A Vestry member is expected to participate fully in parish events and encourage others to do so, attend monthly meetings—held the second Monday of each month at 7:00 p.m.—assist Father Will both in dealing with current issues and in furthering the spiritual growth and programs of St. Andrew's, and take on a major responsibility for some area of parish life and the programs associated with it.

The next few pages include the 2023 Vestry nominees, complete with short bios and their visions of the future of St. Andrew's. Please read these before the Annual Meeting, and introduce yourself to the candidates if you don't know them.

Also, please take a moment to remember the retiring Vestry members (pictured below), and thank them for all their hard work and dedication to St. Andrew's. See you at the meeting!

For the past three years, I served on the Finance and Audit (FAC) Committee, helping the Vestry develop the parish's annual budget, assisting the various ministries and commissions with planning their funding needs, and making recommendations when needed to ensure the budgets are aligned with the Vestry's priorities and fiscal guidance. I also served for three years on the audit committee, conducting the annual audit of the parish's financial statements and internal controls, ensuring the church's finances are managed ethically and efficiently, and in compliance with all
