Dear Friends in Christ,

The paschal candle burns through 50 days of Easter in our Sanctuary, a reminder of Christ's presence and Resurrection. It burns as if it were an eternal flame, reminding us that the action completed on the cross and celebrated at the empty tomb cannot be quenched. The covenant between God and God's people was not simply renewed with Easter but made whole. We reside in this promise and, in this day and age, take the promise through the Baptismal Covenant. We accept the enduring love of God in the promise and live towards and into it.

With this knowledge, why then do we find difficulty in accepting this reality? Often, from our youngest ages, we learn the Scriptures, grow in relationship with God, and seek to live lives that reflect God's desire for us. We know that through our promises we are asked to "love one another," and to "love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind, and with all your strength" and to "love your neighbor as yourself" (Mark 12:30-31). These seemingly simple requests of our covenant do not always connect.

The hiccup comes in connecting our beliefs and what we may profess with our lips with our lives. We seem to hold the ends of the wires just far enough apart so that we may remain safe from the electric current and not quite connect fully. We have seen the empty tomb and heard the Good News and may struggle to leave the room from where the disciples stood. What causes this hesitation? What causes us to lack full trust in our belief in the Gospel?

The gift of God's grace may open our hearts to connect the kingdom of love we profess with our lives in this world. These are the moments when our lives cease to be governed by the rewards of the world and begin to seek the intimations of the kingdom experienced here and now. What is an event in your life which shifted your views forever? In what ways may God's love not only console or radiate but shift your worldview to that of a view of the kingdom? These are the moments we stand next to Cleopas in Luke's Gospel on that road to Emmaus and experience our hearts opening at the presence of the messiah!

As we gather in covenant community, we "continue in the apostles teaching, fellowship, and the breaking of the bread," and ask for God's grace to be given so that we know Christ in the breaking of the bread. As Christ is made known, we live differently. We live in the world but for and towards God's world. Proclaiming the Resurrection in this season professes our faith and calls us to live a life of Resurrection. When we do this together, we carry out the mission of Christ in covenant together.

Connecting our understandings and faith to conviction requires community. We need each other and you are needed in covenant community. How might we be further called to carry out the mission of the Resurrection this Easter and beyond?

Alleluia! Christ is Risen! The Lord is Risen indeed, Alleluia!

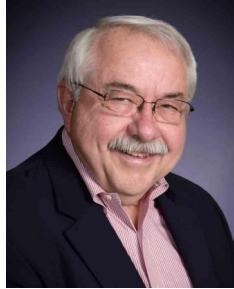

VESTRY NEWS

We have so much to appreciate and to be thankful for in April. Our celebration of the suffering, sacrifice for us, and the resurrection of Christ was the spiritual polestar for the year so far. So many prepared for the services so we could embrace this celebration together, with families and friends remembering the promise of eternal life that is now ours.

Your Rector has been hard at work guiding our worship with the help of our St. Andrew's staff. From Amy, our Family Ministry lead to Gabe, our Music Director, our Seminarian Justin, the many guilds and busy hands that prepared alters and flowers, guided us to our worship places and transmitted the services to those who had to be away, our gratitude for the work well done.

The important Vestry activities include:

- A Vestry Norms survey was completed, helping this new group commit to the process of guiding the work of St. Andrew's. Thanks to Sarah Akins for her work in preparing and collecting the information.
- A Friendship Path will connect St. Andrew's and Adat Reyim so our preschools can travel the short distance between their classrooms to meet as needed. The path is constructed as part of Sam Withington's Eagle Scout project. A dedication will follow the completion of the work by the end of May.
- Our board vacancies are being filled as the terms of prior appointees expire. New Trustees for St. Andrew's will be official recognized by the Fairfax County Court in the coming days.
- Vestry members and those who work with adults and children are expected to attend training courses on avoiding sexual misconduct with youth/elder parish members. Your Vestry will complete courses over the coming weeks to meet those Diocesan requirements.
- Our ESOL program, led by Pat Conrad, has been helping students learn English as a second language through May of this year. Unfortunately, the high winds of March damaged our banner, so Outreach is looking into options for replacing the sign before the program begins next year.

Mapping the Parish Volunteers

Have you ever wondered how you could be involved in preparing for the Parish Picnic, teach a Sunday School class, prepare the altar for services, or make meals for nutrition challenged neighbors? The Vestry will be providing you with opportunities to be part of Team St. Andrew's, enabling you to contribute time and talent. To make it even easier, they are working on ways to enable Realm, our parish database, to provide contacts for you to reach out to help with activities that speak to your hearts as well as contact friends and much more.

Cyber Insurance

You may recall our near miss on a cybercrime last winter, when the quick work of Parish Administrator Michelle Ramsdell and Co-treasurer Pam Rozelsky foiled an attempted theft of our money. We now have an Excess Cyber Liability Protection in addition to our master policy with Church Insurance. Rest assured we are taking the practical steps to protect your information and the St. Andrew's assets, but we are also taking the prudent step to protect us in the event of a future attack.

Work Camp Good News

Nine St. Andrew's youth are set to travel to Dinwiddie, Virginia June 25th-July 1st, for Work Camp. Proceeds from planned car wash and recent Pancake Supper will offset costs for the families and St. Andrew's. Preschool FunDrive

Clean out your closets and cupboards for St. Andrew's Episcopal Preschool! Savers in Woodbridge will pay us per pound for the items we collect. Do some spring cleaning and the preschool community benefits! Savers will pay us: 20 cents per pound for clothes, 10 cents per pound for household items, 5 cents per pound for books.

Examples of items we are collecting: **Clothes** (men's, women's and children's clothes, coats, shoes, scarves, handbags, wallets, fashion accessories, ties, belts, backpacks, etc.); **Household Textiles** (bedding, comforters, blankets, sheets, towels, linen, tablecloths, curtains, pillows, etc.); **Small Household Goods** (kitchen items (such as pots/pans, dishes, silverware, glasses, serving pieces, and hand-held appliances), home decorative items, knick-knacks, toys, games, and small electronics); and **Books** (for all ages). We are not able to donate infant items like high chairs, walkers, or strollers as they are restricted by law.

Packing the items is the hardest part of this fundraiser. Please do not mix clothes, household items, and books. All items must be clean, in sellable condition, and packaged in either black plastic lawn bags or medium sized boxes. Clothes and Household Textiles go in the bags; Small Household Goods and Books go in boxes. Each container must be filled and labeled either CLOTHES, HOUSEHOLD, SMALL HOUSEHOLD GOODS, or BOOKS. Drop off your packed lawn bags and boxes to the preschool on Saturday, May 20th from 1:00-3:00 p.m. in the Back Parking Lot. Do not drop off your items early, we will not take them. Thank you in advance for helping us make this FunDrive a huge success!

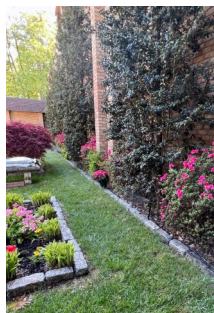
