Dear Friend in Christ,

The Holy Spirit within you moves and calls you into the work of the kingdom. How might the Spirit be at work at St. Andrew's and how

might the Spirit be at work within you? Even skeptics of the faith will speak of a spirit in some form which moves in and through our world today. When have you heard someone described as "full of spirit," or to have "team spirit." Someone described as "spirited" may have a passion and dedication. What if this Spirit is one in the same with the Holy Spirit of which we speak in the Church?

This June Monthly Net goes out the week following Pentecost, the birth of the church and the movement of the Holy Spirit in and through us in this world today. We read of the Holy Spirit in 1 Corinthians 12:

No one can say "Jesus is Lord" except by the Holy Spirit. Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; and there are varieties of services, but the same Lord; and there are varieties of activities, but it is the same God who activates all of them in everyone.

We all participate in the "variety of gifts" which is the spirit manifest in our lives. We heard from our vestry of the manifold gifts present in our church and in the larger community. We saw the commissioning of our first Stephen Ministers who will let God work in and through them in relationship with the power of the Holy Spirit. We sang in our own parts this week creating beautiful music during the sermon to exemplify our voices combining as the gifts of our Spirit combine in the church. The Spirit also moves each of us in the world, beyond the walls of church.

We recognize our unique gifts of the Spirit in Baptism and the renewal of our Baptismal Covenant. With the gift of the Spirit and the community of the church, we come together around a font and table. We remember the seal upon our forehead, given by the Holy Spirit as we were "marked as Christ's own forever." With this knowledge and with the gift of the Spirit we are charged with going out into a world acknowledging the Spirit and adding oxygen to flames of its work.

As we go into the world, we also seek to identify the Spirit's presence. Where do you see evidence of the Spirit alive in the world today? Do you see it in the variety of gifts and in the beauty of the diversity of humanity and God's creation? Do you see it tending to the wounds in the world? Do you see it in celebrating life's events or coming together to mourn? Perhaps we go into a world, even with the skeptical part of our mind, and assume that the Spirit is alive and present. From there, we will see its work in the world and in our own lives.

As we let the reading in many languages from Acts 2 resonate, let the cacophony of voices and languages remind you of the Spirit's varied and ample presence in the world. Know that your voice is needed and adds a flame to the delightful power of God's love which we pray engulfs our world.

As we enter into this season after Pentecost, let us remember the Holy Spirit's work and amplification as we, together, seek to carry out the mission of Jesus Christ.
