NOVEMBER

30TH CHORAL EVENSONG FOR THE FEAST OF ST. ANDREW

7:30 PM | One of the crown jewels of the Anglican patrimony, evensong is derived from ancient monastic daily prayer and is a ritual of canticles, prayers, and anthems sung by the St. Andrew's Choir, peppered with beautiful and rarely-sung hymns for the evening. Lasting well under an hour, this service is musically rich and demands little of newcomers. This particular night is a celebration of our feast of title, and will feature music close to the heart of St. Andrew's including an anthem commissioned from composer David Hurd for the parish's fiftieth anniversary.
