You are no longer strangers and sojourners, but fellow citizens with the saints and members of the household of God. Ephesians 2:19

Dear Friends in Christ,

Have you noticed that the longer you spend with someone the more you tend to take on their characteristics? I notice my Georgia accent from childhood returns, even if slightly, when I spend time with similar accents. We may notice this when our children use words and call each other "bruh," because this is a habit of their friends. We even will use similar body language, facial expressions, and other characteristics of the people with whom we spend time. Sometimes this leads us in a direction in which we want to go and other times, down a path we might rather avoid.

We begin the month of November with the Feast of All Saints', one of the highest feast days which we will also celebrate on Sunday. We recognize some of those great saints of old, such as St. Andrew and also some of the "lesser" saints from our modern era, such as the Episcopal nun Constance and her companions. We also recognize within our tradition that we are all called into sainthood. This is not to be perfect, but to be drawn closer to God and who God truly desires us to be. Where might we go to be the person God is calling us to be and with whom do we surround ourselves to bring us in that direction?

When we look to the saints as examples, we are brought closer to the person God is calling us to be. We may also look to those in our lives who help us be and become our true selves, beloved children of God. The saints of old have the benefit of time to help erase some of the faults of their humanity. The saints around us and of more modern times still have a record of being human. This is one reason why we have a difficult time, sometimes,

grasping the idea of sainthood. There are inevitably people around us to whom we look as examples of saints and bring us closer to God and we too may be those people for others.

In our covenant community, that is a community centered around our Baptismal Covenant, we lean on each other as examples and uphold each other in our promises. These are the promises to live into the faith we profess and to accept that we are beloved. True covenant community, like living in family, takes significant effort and is difficult. We also continue to come to our shared value and profession in faith. With Jesus at the heart of our community, we all aspire to take on his characteristics and profess the love he shares. We gather, look to each other as examples, and profess a common faith so that we might be drawn closer to God.

Looking into this month of November, we gather in gratitude in our covenant community. Think about characteristics of the church and our friends here who have guided you or your children. How might we continue to look to Jesus at the heart of our community to live into who we are called to be?

I look forward to celebrating the Feast of All Saints with you this weekend and continuing throughout November. I am forever grateful for you and our covenant community.

Just as anticipated, Fall is in full swing at St. Andrew's. As we survey the bounty of the harvest provided to us, enjoy the fellowship of our friends at Octoberfest, we also are offering support for those in need.

FACETS Benefit Breakfast

returned October 13th, led by Donna Daugherty, our Outreach FACETS coordinator. Nine St. Andrew's and the Springfield Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints supporters came together with hundreds of FACETS volunteers to recognize the success FACETS and its partners have achieved in reducing and eliminating homelessness in our



county. We support FACETS with hot meals for 150 people twice a month, part of a 365 day a year program to fight food insecurity. In February Steve Koss, Elaine Runkel, and the Outreach team of Paul Foley and Woody Browne will help our parish volunteers open our doors to shelter those facing death from hypothermia. The St. Andrew's Hypothermia Prevention program of more than a decade and the Hot Meals program of more than two decades is evidence of how our blessings are shared with those in need.



Eagles soar at St. Andrew's with our third Scout project now completed. Collin Wyman, son of Preschool Admin Celene Wyman, designed and completed three student tables and one teacher bench to go in the Outdoor classroom. On a rainy October 7th, Collin and his team of scouts and parents put up work tents, assembled the tables, and installed them in the outdoor classroom where 18 students and their teachers can comfortably sit and learn.

The classroom was built as an Eagle Scout project by Thomas Phillips, who created the foundation for the classroom. The construction of the classroom enabled the introduction of the new nature class curriculum. Thomas is the son of St. Andrew's Preschool Director Tami Phillips. The nature curriculum for students was developed by Rachel Ellis, St. Andrew's Preschool Music teacher. It is the only program in our area and provides students the opportunity to learn about nature in a setting created just for them. When weather permits, the students can enjoy their lunches at the tables. No other preschool has a classroom or curriculum like ours.

Thank you to Kelly Nyman, St. Andrew's Preschool teacher, for her volunteer work on our **Friendship Trail** sign. Kelly volunteered to use



her skills with laser cutting letters and signs to help complete this link between friends through the woods. The sign is complete, and shortly will be placed along the Friendship Trail between St. Andrew's Preschool and Adat Reyim's preschool. The trail was part of the Eagle Project of Sam Withington completed this summer. Preschool Director Tami Phillips has been working with Adat Reyim on the joint use of trail connecting the two properties.

Growth does not happen in a vacuum. The **Newcomer Bag Ministry Team** delivers information and a loaf of bread to families interested in learning more about St. Andrew's. When visitors fill out an interest card, Emily Nein will reach out to volunteers to welcome the newcomers. So far this fall we have sent out six newcomer bags since September to families, with more each month. Each bag contains the current Monthly Net, basic

contact and commission information, and a volunteer provided loaf of bread. All of this is delivered with our best wishes, a note if the family is not home or a conversation welcoming them and answering questions. Thanks to Emily Nein, Marlies Durso, Debbie Williams, Karen Spencer, Marifran Bustion, Marietta Mason, Simone Reba, Elaine Runkel, and to the Vestry leadership of Laura Sabo and Karan Wright for helping welcome families to St. Andrew's.

Food for Friends, a longstanding St. Andrew's program providing weekend meals and snacks for children in need, is back. Following years of St. Andrew's Preschool leadership on this program and thousands of meal bags ferried to our partner school by Woody Browne, the program was ready for its next phase. Following a conversation Father Will had with a school counselor at Bonnie Brae Elementary, the program continues. Richard Sellers has volunteered to take on the next phase of our ministry and your support would be graciously accepted. In a county of bounty, some children face insecurity about their next meal and St. Andrew's is there to help.



ESOL (English for Speakers of Other Languages) classes continue meeting each Tuesday under the leadership of Pat Conrad and her team. Students are from all over the world with varying English language skills and educational backgrounds, some just learning English; others want to improve their English. Help acclimating to our community life in Northern Virginia is built into the lessons. Not only do these volunteers teach English, but they find time to help with tasks such as job applications, parent conferences, shopping, and transportation options. St. Andrew's provides an accepting environment for students to feel welcome and supported in their efforts to assimilate into American life. You can help by joining our teaching team. Speaking of St. Andrew's helping, your half ton of food donated to ECHO helped fill the pantry shelves and the plates of our neighbors in need. The Land-Use Task Force continued to meet and discuss options for the land acquired with the purchase of the Graham property. The Vestry has completed a Pro Bono Agreement with David Schneider of Holland and Knight, LLP, to exchange ideas from the taskforce and to explore possibilities, obstacles, and paths to options the Taskforce is exploring. His experience and knowledge will help as we explore possible options for the space. A draft report outlining the work of the Taskforce will be provided to the Vestry in December for their consideration.

Thanks to our **pilgrims**—Lucilla Woodard, Betsy Pugin, and Janet Rife—for carrying the message of love and vigilance for those who suffered from rejection and violence in their battle for equality for all. Their recent journey along the path to desegregation allowed them to stand with those who gave so much so that we might live in dignity and love for all. Their joint sacrifices echo loud across the years and show us at St. Andrew's the way forward.
