"Do not be alarmed; you are looking for Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified. He has been raised; he is not here. Look, there is the place they laid him But go, tell his disciples and

Peter that he is going ahead of you to Galilee; there you will see him, just as he told you." - Mark 16:6b-7.

Alleluia, Christ is Risen! The Lord is Risen Indeed, Alleluia!

Now what? After our Lenten journey, disciplines, and observances, we celebrate the Resurrection. This event occurred nearly 2,000 years ago and we remember and celebrate that salvific act today. This question persists after the disciples discover the empty tomb and it is a question to which the church seeks to continually respond. As individuals, we also ask this question now that death is conquered. Our response is part of our very being in this world.

The disciples in Mark display an abandonment of Jesus at the crucifixion and they are not seen in the ending we read on Easter Sunday (or at the Vigil). This shows us more about their narrative throughout the Gospel. They didn't quite "get" it. They lacked a full participation in the Passion narrative and, while following their friend and prophet Jesus, did not quite understand that this is the Son of God. We recall the voice of God at his baptism is only heard by Jesus. The moments that Jesus is revealed as the Christ (at the Transfiguration, by the demons, by Peter's acclamation), are not fully understand that this revelation occurred for them after the women returned to Galilee, the beginning of the Good News. We read about the disciples in Mark and are now given the full knowledge of Jesus through his Resurrection. Mark sends us back to Galilee where it all began. We celebrate each year and go back to the beginning where it all began, from an empty tomb. Our "so what" begins not only as we celebrate the victory but as we live and share in it.

The victory has been won but it is not over. Living in the victory of the cross is more than an emotional response and over-indulgence of candy. It is the knowledge that in the depths of our grief we have victory. The source of our greatest joy is grounded in this victory. We proceed with a way of being in the world beyond an intellectual knowledge of the Truth, and encounter each other and encounter the world bearing this Truth on our very being.

Our Lenten observance has ended and in our Eastertide places upon us a new and joyful observance. The disciples went back to Galilee and continued in ministry with the full Truth of Jesus. We are now in our Galilee and embark on a new way of Resurrection.

Alleluia, Christ is Risen! The Lord is Risen Indeed, Alleluia!
