Dear Friends in Christ,

I speak often about Covenant Community as a community centered around Christ in our Baptismal Covenant. Christ's one

holy and apostolic church not only brings us into community but participates in the community of all the saints. This is the community where at once we might find our birth into this world and our birth into a new life in Christ in this world and new birth into the life to come. This is a unique community where we may be members from the day we are born until the day we die.

The Feast of Pentecost on May 19th this year concludes the great 50 days of Easter and is a day we celebrate the birth of the church and on which we baptize new members. Each baptism, except in emergencies, in the Episcopal tradition is not only public but includes the whole community. We remember that after we affirm our communal and individual support of the candidates, we are "join with those who are committing themselves to Christ and renew our own baptismal covenant." In this moment, we commit ourselves to God in Christ and in Covenant Community.

At St. Andrew's, our Covenant Community includes a beautiful diversity of individuals and calls us deeper into it. From practicing justice in Sacred Ground and ministering to those who are food insecure in our neighborhoods, we continue in working towards this dream. In ministering to old and young alike, we continue in this dream. In gathering each and every Sunday, we continue in this dream. In and through the gift of you, we continue in this dream.

As part of our continued effort towards this dream and in addition to active ministries, we will be shifting parts of the community with the departure of our beloved Director of Family Ministry, Amy Tibbetts. While we will not replace the position at this time, we will bring in a new position: an Assistant Rector helping oversee children, youth, and families. In so doing, we continue to cultivate this portion of our community while also continuing to cultivate those portions of our community who might not identify with this demographic. The emphasis continues to be on the whole community and we are grateful for the opportunity to live in Covenant Community together.

We recall the words of John Donne as "no man is an island, entire of itself; every man is a piece of the Continent, a part of the main." You are a part of this community (this Continent) and we are excited to continue sharing in the Good News towards God's Dream. As we conclude the Easter Season and head into Pentecost, we recognize Christ's presence in each of us which magnifies the love of God together.

The Vestry thanks the many volunteers for this invaluable ministry to our youth. This month we say goodbye to the leads in our Nursery/Preschool room, Elliot

Nyman and Ann Margaret Ashley. Our little ones have been welcomed by this dynamic duo for the past year and they will be missed!

Speaking of being missed - as many of you are tracking, our beloved Amy Tibbetts will be leaving us in May for her next life adventure in Oregon. We face this farewell with great sadness for our loss, but also with thanksgiving and joy for the ministry of Amy here at St. Andrew's. We know that Amy

is also both sad to leave us and excited to be moving closer to her family in Oregon and that she undoubtedly will continue to stay in touch with us as we will always be her cherished church family.

Amy has served in many capacities as a vital part of our parish life since joining us at St. Andrew's with her family in 2002. Amy's work has been infused with love, joy, and laughter in service to Christ. She has touched every part of our church from worship to outreach to formation.

Over the many years of her ministry, Amy has served on the Vestry twice, as Formation Commission Lead, Junior Warden, and Senior Warden. She coordinated the Women's Fellowship group for several years, planning fun and diverse outings/gatherings for service and fellowship amongst the women of the church. She has coordinated the Godly Play program at St. Andrew's since 2007, with the formation and development of other Godly Play teachers over the years.

Since 2017, she has served as a paid staff person as our Director of Family Ministry. As part of her Family Ministry position, Amy serves both the parish and St. Andrew's Preschool, leading weekly chapel services for our preschoolers and coordinating Sunday School programs and family events. Amy's Vacation Bible School program each summer not only connects multi-generations of parishioners in this worthwhile volunteer effort, it also serves as community outreach to invite children outside of St. Andrew's to come, experience the Gospel, and walk in the footsteps of Jesus through play, music, and engagement with scripture in a fun way.

On the rare Sundays she is not leading the children in their Children's Chapel or at K-2

Sunday School, Amy can frequently be seen up on the altar serving as a Lay Eucharistic Minister or reader during services.

During the pandemic, when we could not safely gather, Amy sent emails, made phone calls, and dropped off special bags and materials to families with young children in our parish to help them feel loved and to keep them connected with the church. Amy pivoted with

excellent creativity to get us online with families to use Zoom for Godly play. She collaborated with the clergy and lay people to create family-friendly outdoor services and activities that kept us all going and connected as a church family. We know that we owe a large part of our ability to stay connected with the church and each other during the period of online worship to Amy's efforts.

We know that we are stronger than ever as a family-friendly church that welcomes and values all parishioners' contributions thanks to Amy's vision. It is a true statement that not a single person has set foot in our space without being greeted, hugged, and introduced to Amy. Her dedication has strengthened our bonds and made us a more welcoming and inclusive church. Amy's impact is evident in the warmth and vibrancy present each week. Each year the Stewardship Commission selects a theme for the year's activities. This year's theme is Casting our Nets. Matthew 4:18-20 states, "As Jesus was walking beside the Sea of Galilee, he saw two brothers, Simon called Peter and his brother Andrew. They were casting a net into the lake, for they were fishermen. 'Come, follow me,' Jesus said, 'and I will send you out to fish for people.' At once they left their nets and followed him."

Casting nets was Andrew's occupational talent and required the focus of much time in maintaining them. They were his tools/treasure in being a fisherman. Following Jesus was much more than leaving fishing equipment behind. In becoming a disciple, Andrew left behind his life training, work, and livelihood. Today we are challenged to make decisions in the areas of sharing talent, allocating time, and contributing wealth to serve the Kingdom of God.

Historically, we have covered the cost of all children and St Andrew's staff attending and supported those who would like to attend but do not have the budget. The fund is getting low this year, and we need your help. To give you a sense of the actual costs we're trying to cover: the cost of one weekend at Shrine Mont for one teen is \$190, the cost of one child is \$140, and our activities fees are about \$200.
