Dear Friends in Christ,

"When the days drew near for him to be taken up, (Jesus) set his face to go to Jerusalem" (Luke 9:51). As we approach the end of Lent, we

journey with Christ toward the cross and, ultimately, the empty tomb. Holy Week, beginning on Palm Sunday and culminating on Easter Sunday, invites us to walk this sacred path with renewed devotion. Just as we were invited into a Holy Lent on Ash Wednesday, so too are we invited to enter fully into Holy Week, preparing our hearts for the joy of the Resurrection.

### What is Holy Week?

Each day holds unique significance as we recount the Passion of Christ. Here's what we will observe together:

### Palm Sunday

We welcome Jesus into Jerusalem, waving palms and shouting "Hosanna!" Yet, by Good Friday, our cries turn to "Crucify him!" During this service, we read the entire Passion Narrative, tracing Christ's journey from triumph to the cross. And yes, there is a donkey!

### Holy Monday-Wednesday

Each day offers special readings, and the Eucharist may be observed. On Wednesday morning at 9:30 a.m., we will gather for Holy Eucharist.

### **Maundy Thursday**

The word "Maundy" comes from the Latin mandatum, meaning "commandment." On this night, we recall Christ's new commandment to love one another as He has loved us. We will wash feet, just as Jesus washed the feet of His disciples. We will also remember the Last Supper and Christ's mandate to celebrate the Eucharist. The service concludes with the solemn stripping of the altar, leaving the sanctuary bare as we depart in silence. This marks the beginning of the Triduum, the great three days.

### **Good Friday**

At noon, the hour when Christ was crucified, we will gather for the Stations of the Cross, walking through seven scriptural stations, reading, and praying at each. At 7:00 p.m., we will continue our observance with a traditional Good Friday service. Eucharist is not celebrated on this day. This somber day calls us to reflect on the depth of Christ's sacrifice.

### **Holy Saturday**

At 9:00 a.m., we will hold a brief service as prescribed by the Book of Common Prayer. At this moment, Christ is in the tomb, and we wait. Following the service, we will prepare the church for the joy to come.

### The Great Vigil of Easter

This ancient and beautiful service begins after sunset on Holy Saturday, 8:00 p.m. We kindle the new fire outside and carry the light into the church. As we move through the service, we proclaim the Resurrection with joyful acclamation. This powerful liturgy marks the turning point from death to life, darkness to light.

### **Easter Day**

Join us for one of our three joyous celebrations at 7:30, 9:00, and 11:15 a.m.! Easter is the holiest day of the year—a triumphant declaration that death has been conquered. As people of the Resurrection, we rejoice in the hope Christ has given us!

This overview offers just a glimpse into the depth and beauty of Holy Week. You are invited to come and experience it for yourself. If you are traveling, you may attend services elsewhere or join us online. Wherever you find yourself this Holy Week, may it be blessed.

Dear ones.

Have you heard? There is a Renovation Team at St. Andrew's!

No, we aren't pulling up floorboards or choosing paint colors. But we are taking measured steps to renovate the structural supports of our children and youth ministries.

The purpose of the Renovation Team is to build a children and youth ministry that lasts for the long haul, like the house built on rock. It is a slow, deliberate process—one that requires not just one individual but a team of dedicated individuals who are willing to help build the infrastructure, nail by nail, brick by brick. Progress may seem slow and incremental in this 18-month process, which began last spring; but the results will be exponential across years of investment of time and resources. It is a really exciting time to invest in the future of St. Andrew's.

I am thrilled to share with you the dedicated members of our re-formed team: Katie Campbell, Renee Cone, Erica Dillon, Mtr Maria (chair), Lisa Rollo, Laura Sabo, Michael Tune, and Ali Wiedeman. In between the two iterations of this team—the one formed prior to my arrival and the one re-formed after—we have had several outstanding members carrying on their projects with determination and resolve. I want to thank Katie Campbell, who gathered information and organized an accurate database of our children, youth, and families, so that we can effectively communicate with them. Her hard work laid the groundwork for the transition to Realm with Sunday School volunteer scheduling and attendance tracking.

Thank you as well to Lisa Rollo and Renee Cone, who have made painstaking, time-consuming efforts to list and create job descriptions for all the volunteer roles necessary to operate St. Andrew's children, youth, and family ministry programming for an entire year. Job descriptions improve the overall health of the church by clearly stating expectations from the outset of any volunteer ministry role, rendering more clarity among interconnected roles, and helping us lift up new leadership in teams that may be stretched thin or otherwise desiring new people. These descriptions are already proving invaluable to us as we invite more people into shared ministry.

As you may be seeing already, running successful children, youth, and family ministries (and any ministry, for that matter) requires solid infrastructure—that is to say,





Each fall, we gather our weary, our




Mornings open with worship and prayer, the kind that settles deep and stays with you. We gather in sacred rhythm—sharing stories, breaking bread, lifting


