You shall receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you shall be my witness in Jerusalem, and in all Judea, and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth. Acts 1:8

Dear Friends in Christ,

The Spirit goes by many names. We name the Spirit as the creative energy which moved over the formless void in the creation story in Genesis 1, as Roo'akh (רוֹהַ). Our Rite I services carry the term Holy Ghost. In the Baptism of Jesus, we see the Spirit like a dove coming down, which is the pneuma ( $\pi v \epsilon \tilde{v} \mu \alpha$ ). This Spirit is carried in many ways, including when Jesus breathes on his disciples with the verb emphaó ( $\hat{\epsilon} \mu \phi v \sigma \acute{\alpha} \omega$ ). We talk about Spirit—he, she, it—as the palpable love that exists between God the Father and God the Son, and which is alive in us today. It is this creative energy, indwelling Spirit, and presence of God which moves in and through the Church and enables us to encounter a new world today.

Should we want to cite chapter and verse for many cultural components of the Greek Hellenistic era in early Christianity and before, we can certainly do so. What may be more difficult is to cite chapter and verse in relation to how we encounter Artificial Intelligence. We do not see Jesus using ChatGPT. Our Scriptures arise from a Middle Eastern, collectivist, and tribal culture thousands of years ago. Does this mean that God does not speak to a modern world with individualistic and collectivist cultures in an interdependent and often symbiotic global existence? We will fall short when trying to find specific citations for unique, modern events. However, the gift of the Spirit and the gift of the Church enable us to see and discern God's movement in all places and at all times.

The Spirit's movement over the disciples gave birth to a Church to carry out a New Covenant for a growing and changing world. The Old Covenant was not destroyed, but renewed through the death, Resurrection, and Ascension of Jesus. We too were given the gift of the Spirit. This is the same creative energy which moved over a formless void in

the Creation of all that came to be. This is the same Spirit present at Jesus' baptism and at our baptism. It is the same Spirit which moves through us, knows us, and calls us each by name. This gift of the Spirit enables us not only to encounter a modern world, but to bring the new Covenant into a world which continues to need it.

We often feel diminutive and ineffective against global powers and movements. This can lead to despair, in place of the hope given to us in the Gospel and through the Spirit. As we reaffirm our Baptismal Covenant this Pentecost, we remember that "with God's help" includes the Holy Spirit. How do we begin to respond to the Beatitudes in Matthew and Luke when we encounter "the least of these in our society?" We are given power in the Holy Spirit, collectively, to live in the Spirit in the here and now. This is the strength given to us when we do not have strength left to give.

How might the Spirit at St. Andrew's lead us into this new age? It does not necessarily mean transform our chapel space into a coffee house. It might guide us as we see an increasingly "busy" world in need of God's rest. It may lead us to lift those whose humanity is diminished in our community and the world. It will guide us to become the church, grounded in the past and for the future.

As we gather in celebration of the Holy Spirit at the Feast of Pentecost this Sunday, we remember that it moves through us in worship, and in a world which seeks to continually lift our own control and agency over that of God. We wear red as a sign of the Spirit, and we remember that it is always moving in and through us. The Spirit has worked, and will continue to work, in powerful ways in our lives—individually and as a church.

I look forward to worshiping with you at this High Feast day, to baptizing new members, to eating good barbeque, to listening to good music, to worshiping and proclaiming the Resurrection, and to coming together in the fellowship of the Spirit.

budget line!), and are now enjoying a beautiful spring. Next up: the mad dash to the end of the school year, summer vacation fun, and our old friends humidity and mosquitos.

One of the sure signs that summer is approaching is our annual Parish Picnic, to be held on Sunday, June 8th. Pam Hardin and the Fellowship team are planning a fantastic event and hope to see everyone there. If you haven't signed up yet, please do! Congratulations to Katie Campbell on her selection as the preschool's new chapel and music teacher! She will be a fantastic addition to the preschool team, and the children will surely benefit from her energy and caring spirit. As she steps into this new role as a church employee, Katie will be stepping down from the Vestry, making this the preschool's gain and the Vestry's loss. We'll soon be seeking someone to serve the remainder of her term.

One of our recent standout events was the FoMA (Friends of Music and the Arts) concert, which was a highlight for everyone who attended. We extend our heartfelt gratitude to the FoMA committee for organizing such a meaningful event and to the Main Street Chamber Players for sharing their talents with us. Events like these remind us of the power of music to uplift, unite, and glorify God.

Our Safety & Security Commission, led by Carol Robinson, recently organized a CPR/AED training class for ushers and greeters. The class was attended by 17 participants who are now trained and ready to provide life-saving assistance. While we pray those skills never have to be used, it's reassuring to know that members of the St. Andrew's community are prepared to step in if needed. Many thanks to Carol and Ann DiMisa for coordinating this important and potentially life-saving training.

Following recommendations from the Fairfax County Police Department and our Safety & Security Commission, the Vestry has approved new procedures for locking some doors during Sunday services. Details about the timing and implementation of these procedures will be shared soon.

Speaking of security, a new interior door will be installed in the hallway leading to the education wing. Scheduled to begin in late June, this project will significantly enhance the safety and security of our preschool children.

Another major project—the installation of new flooring in the Parish Hall—is projected to also start in late June. After a thorough review of materials and meetings with potential contractors, the Property Resource Commission has finalized plans. Thanks to a generous donation from a parishioner, the project is fully funded and ready to move forward.

Thank you to Mother Maria and all the youth and children who participated in the youth-led service on May 18th. It was a fantastic idea, beautifully executed! I know I wasn't nearly brave enough at that age to step up to the altar to preach or read scripture, and I genuinely admire those who did. It's inspiring to see the Holy Spirit at work through our young people—and reassuring to know that the future of our church is in such good hands!

We welcome and thank Kat Benjamin as our new Vacation Bible School Director and Virginia Sertich as Assisting Director. We are thrilled for the upcoming "True North" VBS, from July 28th through August 1st. Volunteers are welcome and needed to help make this a memorable experience for our young ones. If you're new to Shrine Mont, this is your invitation to come and be part of something deeply good. The beauty of the weekend isn't in a packed schedule, but in the space we make—for each other, for God, and for ourselves.

#### **Locking Procedures During Sunday Worship**

In response to the Fairfax County Police Department's 2024 security assessment, and as part our continuing commitment to providing a safe and secure environment for all to worship, serve, and belong, the clergy, Vestry, and Safety & Security Commission are implementing a phased approach to locking certain doors during the 10:00 a.m. service. This is a proactive measure designed to enhance safety by limiting entry points monitored by ushers during worship.

Effective Sunday, June 1st, the door next to the Nursery (door #8) will be locked at 10:15 a.m. Posted signage will direct parishioners and visitors to enter through the door next to the Preschool office (door #7), the door next to the Memorial Garden (door #6) or either door located at the front of the church.

Later in June and early July, the door next to the Preschool office (door #7) and the Parish Hallway door (door #1) will also be locked at 10:15 a.m. Posted signage will direct parishioners and visitors to enter through either the doors to the Narthex or the Memorial Garden door (door #6).

Throughout June and July, we would like feedback from our parishioners regarding this proactive approach to securing the Education Wing and the Nave. In August, the Vestry will review any feedback and determine if this will become a permanent protocol for our church.

## New Assistant Bishop and Canon for Discipleship Start June 1





New Assistant Bishop Mark A. Bourlakas and Canon for Discipleship Ricardo Sheppard begin June 1st, exponentially increasing the Diocese of Virginia's capacity to love Jesus, embody justice, and be disciples.

Bourlakas' new call makes three bishop-level leaders who "can spend more time out in and around the Diocese of Virginia getting to know people, getting to know ministries, and for me that's really exciting," Bishop E. Mark Stevenson said.

Introducing the New Assistant Bishop

The Rt. Rev. Mark A. Bourlakas comes from the Diocese of Southwestern Virginia, where he served as the diocesan bishop since July 2013. The 50 parishes there are mostly rural and stretch to the Virginia tip that is as far west as Detroit.

Bourlakas is the twelfth assistant bishop in diocesan history and will be providing support for the Episcopacy across the diocese. Additionally, he will collaborate closely with the Office of Congregational Vitality, and encourage parishes to boldly go beyond comfort into the mission field of their changing communities.

Introducing the New Canon for Discipleship

Sheppard has been rector of The Episcopal Church of the Atonement in Washington, DC, since 2019. Both his parents attended seminary while expecting him, so Sheppard likes to say that his discipleship journey began "in the belly." Born in Trinidad and Tobago, he immigrated to the United States in 1975.

He enlisted in the US Marine Corps and was honorably discharged after serving 9  $\frac{1}{2}$  years. He earned a masters of divinity degree from Princeton Theological Seminary and a diploma in Anglican studies from the University of the South School of Theology in Sewanee. He was ordained a priest in 2016.

In Washington, he has served as chaplain at the Bishop Walker Episcopal School for Boys, on the Diocesan Council, and chairs the Diocesan Committee on Black Ministries. Prior to coming to The Episcopal Church, Sheppard served as the youth and outreach minister at the church founded by his father in 1983: Hebron Baptist Church in Brooklyn.
