Dear Friends in Christ,

What would you say to someone who asks what you believe? As an Episcopalian, you can open to page 358 (or 326) in the Book of Common Prayer and tell them exactly what

you believe. We say this profession of faith at every Eucharist and its companion, the Apostles' Creed at Evening Prayer. However, many of us, myself included, have professed without thinking about the statements made or from where they came. It is important to engage our Creed in today's world.

The logical question to ask is "why do we need to study the Creed?". In today's world, we experience continued division and many ideologies, theologies, and opinions. This is a time to ground ourselves in the Resurrection and what we believe. "We Believe," was the theme of the week of Christian Unity earlier this year and it continues to resonate in Credal Churches as we observe the 1700th anniversary.

To facilitate our formation we will bring in a host of speakers on a variety of topics and themes. I will provide an overview and prime our formation with major themes and topics this Sunday, September 7th.

These sessions will enable each of us to better understand the faith we profess and what it means today for the church and for us individually. The gaps in the calendar are held for additional faith formation subjects or held for Vestry presentations so you can plan on attending adult formation each Sunday after the 10:00 a.m. service.

I look forward to seeing you in this new program year as we all profess our faith and worship together.

The altar flowers are not supported by the operating budget of the church, so we rely completely on your generous contributions. The suggested amount is \$25.00 per listing in the service bulletin for a desired Sunday. Names should be received one week prior to the desired Sunday.

You can request altar flowers two different ways: Fill out the Flower Contribution Envelope located in the narthex or on the bulletin board outside the church office, and enclose cash or check. The envelope can be given to an usher or left in the church office.

If you prefer to request and pay for flowers online, you can contribute towards the Flower Guild through Realm: https://onrealm.org/standrewsVA/give/flowers. Be sure to use the memo line to say who the flowers are for and the occasion.
