I encourage us to continue to approach life and our ministry through the lens of abundance, reflecting upon the abundant grace of God in which we find through Jesus Christ. Through this lens of gratitude, I ask you to consider how you can engage in the spiritual practice of stewardship this coming year. Please know that your financial pledge is distinct from a secular "fundraising" drive. With this spiritual practice we also provide for the practical needs of paying staff salaries, keeping up with building repairs, and sending resources back into the community. Consider how you give of time and talent. Every cent and second is not only appreciated but something to which we give thanks and glory to God. Thank you for your ministry and gifts!

I look forward to seeing you this Sunday as we give thanks to God for the many gifts in this life and as we celebrate the gift of the Resurrection. Please mark October 18/19 on your calendar as the Sunday when we offer our pledges for the coming year.

September was quite a month for the Reba family. It kept me away from church for much of the month, so I don't

have much of a "report" to share. But during that time, Simone and I were reminded repeatedly of the goodness of God, for which we are eternally grateful.

Our daughter Emily was expecting our first grandchild, due on September 12th. At our Vestry meeting on September 8th, I asked that Emily and the baby be included in our pravers. About an hour later. Simone called to tell me Emily was in labor. I excused myself, hurried home, and we booked the first flight to Phoenix the next morning. While in the air, we received a text from our son-in-law, Zach, announcing that baby Dean Robert Wilson had been born. A few hours later we were at the hospital, holding that little miracle for the first time. He was happy, healthy, and, like most newborns, working hard to figure out how to eat. The memories came rushing back to when Emily herself was born 28 years ago. And though I know you may find it hard to believe that Simone and I are old enough to be grandparents (ha, ha!), we now proudly wear that title.

A few days after our arrival, Simone tested positive for COVID, and when she recovered, it was my turn. Thankfully, God answered our many prayers, and Dean and his parents stayed healthy. While isolating, we made the best of the time and explored the desert Southwest. We visited Joshua Tree National Park, Petrified Forest National Park, and the Painted Desert. We stood among petrified trees more than 200 million years old and stargazed in Dark Sky areas where,

through a telescope, we saw the Andromeda Galaxy—2.5 million light years away, with more than a trillion stars. And it is just one of an estimated two trillion such galaxies in the observable universe. Numbers like that make it difficult to comprehend the vastness of the universe.

In those moments, I was struck by how small and insignificant we really are. And yet, the God who created all of it cares deeply for each one of us. He knows us, loves us, and blesses us with new life and reminders of His presence every day.

That is the good news we carry as a congregation: whether in the birth of a child, the prayers of a community, or the majesty of creation, God's goodness surrounds us. Thanks be to God!
