Dear Friends in Christ,

We arrive at the final days of our Lenten journey this Holy Wednesday as we enter into the sacred Triduum (observance of Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter Vigil) beginning tomorrow. I encourage you to read the [article from our Ordinand and Seminarian, Anne Alexis on Holy Week](#). It is a time when we will transition from this penitential season following Christ to his death on the cross and to his Resurrection. These observances capture what it is to be a Christian.

As a church, we enter a time of transition. As we decide to retain the land and pass on an opportunity to sell, we experience death, Resurrection, and renewal. Our discernment of land stewardship began prior to my arrival here and we mark a huge moment on our larger discernment. Our stewardship of the land will parallel our vision and mission living into the Baptismal Covenant and the Great Commission. The Vestry heard our identity living into our Covenant in Worship, Outreach, Ministry of Space, Active Discipleship, Pastoral Care, and Fellowship.

We find a time of transition for us as we decide to retain the land and pass on an opportunity for a continuing care community to be developed next door in conjunction with a generous financial offer. This decision of stewardship is not to stagnate as this would be akin to burying our talent. We are in a time of renewal as our identity will inevitably be tied to the stewardship of our resources. In this renewal, we experience the end of a season and rise into a new one. We will have more information on May 3rd in a presentation to the parish and we will need the Spirit's work in and through you. Our next steps will look towards how we continue to live into this for the church of now and the future.

Now, we turn to what is right in front of us this Holy Week. We walk this sacred journey to the cross and tomb in remembrance of these events and in a very real way experiencing them. As we approach the empty tomb, we seek to rise again. In that tomb we find not simply emptiness, but those real facets of our life that are of God. We also have an opportunity to leave those components of our life that are not of God in that space. Nothing makes life clearer than death. We experience this on Good Friday and we experience what it is to rise again on Easter Sunday and throughout our lives. We experience this as a church body and individually.

I look forward to worshipping with you this Holy Week and Easter and encourage you to invite your friends and family to join us this Easter and as we live a resurrected life together.

"Welcome happy morning" is the opening phrase of my favorite Easter hymn and a declaration of a magnificent change – one that is just days away!

Lent is a time to create space for self-examination and to refocus on the sacrifice Jesus made for us. However, for me, the seemingly never-ending winter weather and continued hours of standard time darkness contribute to it being a fairly melancholy and gray period. Yet, even in the cold, windy, and potentially overcast 40 days of Lent, St. Andrew's found multiple ways to fight the dreary and turn on the light. Several examples follow below.

- The hugely successful Shrove Tuesday pancake supper brought the Episcopal Youth Community (EYC) group over \$1000 to support upcoming 2026 projects. Participants ate a hearty dinner, played youth-led games, and learned that to be "shriven" or obtain absolution allows us to begin the Lenten season "with a clean slate."
- Under the supervision of Rebecca Umberger, we held four Lenten Soup Suppers in March encouraging fellowship, the sharing of a simple meal, and hearing testimonies of faith.
- A Men's Fellowship Coffee was held on the morning of February 13, at the Springfield Panera and a Women's Fellowship event held on March 19 -- each providing a welcoming opportunity for community and connection for "old" parishioners and newcomers.
- Karen Hilber organized an additional Women's Fellowship event, continuing our monthly birthday celebration schedule with a February 21 lunch at Villa Bella restaurant.
- Our Seminarian, Anne Alexis, held Sunday morning Bible Study, beginning on February 22, exploring the multifaceted question of what it means to be a Christian.
- In mid-March, our Minister of Music, Organist and Choirmaster, Alan Moser, provided a Choral Evensong, helping us to renew our Lenten prayers and refresh our individual journeys toward the Easter celebration.

- From February 17- March 19, we hosted our friends from the Peace Islamic Center (PIC), providing a welcoming space for their tradition of prayer during Ramadan.
- On March 28, St. Andrew's "Team Believe" held its annual Purse and Jewelry Sale as a fundraiser for the American Cancer Society's Relay for Life. Special thanks go to Rebeca Umberger for organizing and steering the fundraiser and to Elaine Runkel and Christine Kelly for heading up the relay team.
- Throughout the Lenten season the Vestry continued serious discussion and discernment on St. Andrew's land stewardship opportunities, resulting in a final recommendation, in late March, to retain the property and prayerfully consider other use strategies.

This brief list of activities is a testament to the number of events alive within our parish, even during a hectic Holy season. None of which could be accomplished without the church staff, the Commission leaders, and volunteers – so a huge thank you to those named and unnamed.

During our February Vestry retreat, a key goal identified for 2026 is a "Fully Engaged St. Andrew's" with a focus on increasing discipleship and lay involvement. Father Will likes to refer to our ability to get things accomplished with a limited number of volunteers as "scrappy." I like to think of it as grace – recognizing what needs to be done, a simple acceptance of involvement, and a quiet steadfast faith to complete the tasks. We can all use a little more grace! Please consider using your time and talents to support the numerous ministries of this parish. Spring is a perfect time to spring into action!

Anne Alexis' most recent sermon reminds us that death and darkness always precede resurrection. Out of the darkness brings us the brightest light – the risen Lord as the "Light of the World." This is best captured in the final verse of Hymn 179:

"...show thy face in brightness, bid the nations see; bring again our daylight: day returns with thee. Welcome happy morning! age to age shall say."

Happy Easter to all.

Dear People of God at St. Andrew's,

We are transitioning out of Lent and marching toward our observance of Holy Week. Holy Week is the week in the church year when we literally keep time with Jesus in His final earthly hours. This Holy Week feels distinctly special for me as it is the last Holy Week I will observe in this wonderful community. Graduation is just six weeks away. God willing and with the consent of the people, this will be my last Holy Week as a layperson. If you will indulge me, I'd like to offer some reflections on these most holy days the church global is preparing to observe.

We will begin our "timekeeping" with Jesus beginning Sunday when we observe Palm Sunday. We will celebrate Jesus' triumphal - but peaceful - entrance into Jerusalem. Like the crowds gathered at the Jerusalem gates, we will wave palm leaves and shout "Hosanna! Hosanna to the Son of David!" Hosanna is translated, "Have mercy on us," which feels especially appropriate for our times.

Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday of Holy Week are marked as special days of prayer. There is also the Wednesday morning Eucharist to which all are invited.

Thursday marks the beginning of the Triduum, the three holiest days of the Christian year. The Triduum (meaning "Three Days") consist of Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Great Vigil of Easter. You might note there is no dismissal after the Maundy Thursday liturgy. The ancient church - and current liturgical theologians - understood the Triduum as a unitive liturgy. Yes, we go home in between the services, but it is observed as one cohesive liturgy. The Triduum was also the sacred time in which converts to the faith were in the very final stages of preparation for their initiations (baptism) at the Vigil.

On Maundy Thursday, we wash one another's feet, remembering Christ washing the feet of His disciples. We will celebrate the Holy Eucharist. After the Eucharist, we will strip the altar as a way of continuing our journey in Jesus's footsteps. After washing the disciples' feet, Jesus was

betrayed by Judas Iscariot and handed over to the Roman authorities. We strip the altar to prepare for the emptiness of the world when Jesus dies.

Good Friday is the Christian day of atonement (think: at-one-ment). It is the day we witness to Christ's sacrifice on the cross for us. Jesus was an innocent man condemned to a humiliating and brutal state-sanctioned death. He willingly assumed the cross to reconcile the whole creation to the Godhead. Truly, there has never been a greater act of love for us. It is a day to mourn, to grieve, and to show solidarity with our siblings across the world who suffer. It is the day we are both closest to, and farthest away from, God.

Saturday night we celebrate the Great Vigil of Easter. This is the most ancient of our liturgies, with its origins dating back to the Second Century. We hear our deacon sing the Exsultet, enter the church in the dark, and hear a record of God's saving deeds throughout our history. We will baptize (YAY, BAPTISM!) and with joy declare the first Easter proclamation, that Christ is in fact risen. We will leave the church with the lights on both in the sanctuary and in our hearts.

I hope you will join us for all of our Holy Week services as we join our voices in prayer, song, lament, praise, and ultimately, joy. Every year Holy Week elicits new feelings and dimensions in my spiritual life. It is always an honor to pray alongside my fellow Christians and to give thanks for the sacrifice that has facilitated our salvation. But, really, St. Andrew's, it is a joy to serve you all during these holy days. Know that, as you have been in my prayers, you will remain there as we journey these most holy days together.
