Dear Friends in Christ,

We pray each week for those from our church and for those on our extended prayer list who need prayers for healing. Our prayer guild prays for each of these individuals and they also have other names not publicly listed. You may notice that our prayer list continues to extend even as people return to health. Jesus provides the example of pastoral care as he speaks to Peter about love and tending to sheep. We, too, follow this example of love in our community and into our lives.

The Latin pastor means shepherd, pointing to "The Good Shepherd," in Jesus Christ. In addition, ordained leaders and other ministers serve as pastors or shepherds for those in spiritual need or guidance. "Pastoral Care" refers to the spiritual guidance, help, and support for all of us by priests, ministers, and our fellow brothers and sisters in Christ. In the threefold interrogation, Jesus reiterates that in Christian love, we feed and care for each member of the body of Christ.

Pastoral care looks different in many scenarios. You may view a pastoral visit as when the priest visits you in the hospital, providing Eucharist, prayers, and anointing with unction. This is pastoral care and your clergy will try to visit you if you are in the hospital and desire a visit. Pastoral care also looks like any of us calling a person we haven't seen in church, asking someone how they are (beyond surface conversation), showing up for a funeral, bringing food to a family in need, praying for a friend, coming to church, visiting with a Stephen Minister, and so much more.

Many people who return to church find themselves in a scenario which needs pastoral care. This may resonate with you as you read this article. Perhaps you moved locations and need the comfort of a church, experienced a recent death, got married, are struggling with anxiety, can't let go of an addiction, need deeper meaning in life, and more. At St. Andrew's, I encourage all of us to recognize that we are each ministers of the Gospel and do not need to be trained in hospital visitations to call someone or to honestly ask, "how are you," after church. We do this well and I would like us to continue to cultivate these practices.

One unique form of pastoral care at our parish is Stephen Ministry which provides one on one pastoral care with a trained minister. These ministers meet with individuals who experienced grief in its many forms from death, job loss, and divorce, birth, and more. In these relationships, God is able to enter and provide the "curegiving." I encourage you to learn more about Stephen Ministry on June 7th during our forum hour.

We look to Jesus, our Good Shepherd, as the model for pastoral care. As disciples of Jesus, we hear Jesus' threefold question and requirement to tend to and feed. Peter is not exempt for the need of pastoral care just as each of us is called to give and receive. In simple questions, showing up, worshiping together, and following Christ we engage in pastoral care.

What has been your experience with pastoral care in both giving and receiving? Who comes to your mind as someone in need of a phone call or conversation? What gesture might you extend this week? We also ask, in what ways am I in need of God's love? Who are my friends and my ministers with whom I can share this experience?

I look forward to seeing you this weekend as we observe Trinity Sunday!

Our church calendar and activities also recognize the emerging warm season. For our youngest parishioners, Vacation Bible School (VBS) is scheduled for Monday, July 27 through Friday, July 31 to "explore the nature of God" in Rainforest Falls. Please be aware that registration closes on June 1, 2026 for campers (ages 3.5 to 9). A huge thank you in advance goes to Virginia Sertich, VBS Director, for her leadership and to all others who have agreed to assist. Extra helping hands are always welcome.

Finally, nothing screams summer like Popsicles on the Playground, which was initiated over Memorial Day Weekend and will continue after the 10:00 a.m. services. Details on how volunteers can assist and the specific schedule will be forthcoming.

Before we leave the month of May, I want to thank the number of volunteers that gave up their Saturday morning on May 16th to assist with the Spring Parish Clean Up. Under the guidance of Gail Bouton (Jr. Warden) the cleaning team successfully vacuumed, dusted, polished, tossed, and organized. We even sold two gas grills off Facebook Marketplace to an eager homeowner.

Further, Vestry members Karen Spencer (Fellowship), Pam Hardin, and Becky Haler (Formation) planned and led a wonderful Parish Picnic on May 17th. The food, games, face painting, music, and fellowship were exceptional and even the weather cooperated – not too hot and not too wet! Father Will made a presentation of a time capsule, originally created for the 50th Anniversary celebration, noting that it would be buried on the church property. He also thanked the Sunday School teachers and Youth Group leaders for their time and energy in making a difference for our children and teens over the past church school year. I would like to pile on with a huge shout out of appreciation to the number of parishioners who assisted with the picnic set up and take down, the serving of food, management of games, and final clean up. I am always amazed at the giving nature of this parish. Job well done!

And finally, as we prepare for our own fabulous summer weekend getaways and week-long family vacations, let us please remember those that struggle to secure basic necessities. From June 1- June 21, St. Andrew's will be hosting a collection drive for the Lamb Center of both gently used and newly purchased items. The details can be found here and in the Weekly Net. We are updating our door code policy and will **deactivate all existing door codes by July 13th**.

To get a new code, you will need to:

- 1) Complete the required online Safe Church courses ([Limited Access Code](#) - most people) ([All Access Code](#) - Vestry, Staff, etc.)
- 2) Email your transcript to Emily in the church office
- 3) Visit the office to fill out and sign a form.

This includes anyone using a group code (choir, flower guild, etc.). Also, If you have any physical keys, be sure to bring them with you so they can be turned in or checked out again. Remember, do not share your personal code with anyone or your group code with someone not in the group.
